

GORDONSVILLE HIGH SCHOOL DRESS CODE

Students shall dress and groom in a clean, neat and modest manner so as not to distract or interfere with the operation of the school. When a student is attired in a manner which is likely to cause disruption or interference with the operation of the school, the principal shall take appropriate action, which may include suspension. Tennessee law prohibits students from wearing, while on school grounds of a public school during the regular school day, clothing that exposes underwear or body parts in an indecent manner that disrupts the learning environment. Violations of the individual dress code policies shall be subject to the disciplinary action under the Student Code of Conduct. The following are mere guidelines for appropriate dress and are not intended to be an exhaustive list. All dress code violations will be determined by the discretion of the administration.

All school clothing must be free of tobacco products, profanity, alcohol, drugs or drug paraphernalia, sexual themes, ethnic groups or signs, racist overtures or any signs of offensive sayings or gestures.

- . No holes or frays
- . No visible tattoos
- . No facial piercings
- . No unnatural shades of hair coloring
- . No Mohawk hairstyles
- . No sunglasses or caps in the building
- . Sweat pants must be size appropriate
- . Leggings, spandex, yoga pants and etc. must be covered by shorts, shirts or skirts that are knee length
- . Shorts, dresses, skirts and etc. must be knee length
- . No sleeveless shirts or tank tops
- . No chains or dog collars are to be worn or carried in school
